



Travelling to Sibiu (Hermannstadt)

Arriving by plane

Sibiu has an international airport (SBZ) with several direct connections. The airport is located 5,8 km from the city center.

Getting from the airport to your destination:

- Bolt or Uber:
- **Taxi** (example of companies: yellow vehicles with 942, 953 written on them). Use only cabs which display transportation license, prices and are using taximeters. The **maximum tariff** for taxi services approved by City Hall of Sibiu is 3,93 lei / km (most of them accept just cash payments).
- Bus: bus line 11 (to downtown) stops 300 meters away from the airport. Bus tickets (3 lei, valid 60 minutes after scanning the QR code / card) can be paid by card (on the yellow contactless devices within the bus) or through the SibiuBus app. Details about the route are available at www.tursib.ro/trasee/harta or within SibiuBus app (bus line 11 is shown in purple).

Accommodation














Let Sibiu surprise you

Any tourist guide of Sibiu will help you find out a lot of interesting things about the well-known landmarks and tourist attractions. Additionally, we have listed a few suggestions to give your experience a little extra charm.

- ❖ Take a look at Sibiu from above: there are two towers from which you have a splendid view over the entire city up to the Făgăraş Mountain crests: the Evangelical Church Tower and the Council Tower. Additionally, you can enjoy a drink or meal while watching the sunset in the panoramic restaurant of the 4-star hotel Golden Tulip Ana Tower (585 Fusion restaurant, located at the 11th floor on 2 Şcoala de Înot street).
- ❖ Discover traditions, culture and folk art in the open-air Astra Museum: with over 400 architectural and folk-art monuments, exhibited on nearly 100 hectares, Astra Museum is Europe's largest open-air ethnographic exhibition. It will surprise you to find out that the largest windmill collection in the world is here and not in Holland.













- ❖ Explore the network of hidden passages and stairs which connect the city's Upper Town and Lower Town: they are a distinct brand of Sibiu and add a mysterious touch to the city centre. The narrow streets open from place to place to small squares, where the sounds of the city fade away. Head towards Pasajul Scărilor or Turnul Scării Aurarilor. Near Casa cu Cariatide you can find another "hidden passage" which will take you to Nicolae Bălcescu street (the main walking and shopping street in the historical center). And these are just a few of them.
- ❖ Tired already?! Enjoy a craft beer, a glass of wine, coffee, or a snack. There are a lot of options especially in the Large and Small Square. To narrow them down, you might want to stop at NOD Pub (in the Small Square), The Refresh (in the Large Square, for a healthy energy boost; you can order only at the bar), Cafe Wien (Huet Square, for an authentic feel of a typical coffeehouse in Vienna). Looking for a place closer to the conference venue?! How about Thurta Grill and Bar or Grădina, to name a few of the many options.
- ❖ **Do you like premieres?!** Here are a few milestones in Sibiu history:
 - 1292 the first hospital in Romania;
 - 1380 the first documented school in Romania;
 - 1494 the first pharmacy in Romania;
 - 1544 the first book in Romanian is printed here;
 - 1717 the first brewery in Romania opens here;
 - 1788 the first Theatre Hall is inaugurated in Sibiu (the **Thalia Hall**, near the Large Square, 3 Cetății street, used today by the State Philharmonics);
 - 1817 opens the **Brukenthal Museum**, the first museum in Romania and South-Eastern Europe;
 - 1859 the **Liars Bridge** is the first iron cast bridge in Romania;
 - 1869 the Association Library, the first Romanian public library in Transylvania is founded in Sibiu;
 - 1895 the **Museum of Natural History** (also on Cetății street) is opened in the first building in Romania built with the purpose of hosting a museum;
 - 1929 the first Zoo Garden in Romania;
 - 1944 "Junii Sibiului" is founded, the oldest folkloric dance ensemble in Romania;
 - 1993 the first **museum of universal ethnography** in Romania opens in Sibiu (Franz Binder Museum located at 11 Small Square);
 - 2007 Sibiu is the first city in Romania to obtain the title of European Capital of Culture;
 - 2019 Sibiu is European Gastronomic Region, the first city in Romania to obtain this title.
